Major service and repairs to be undertaken in the workshop by a competent person. Faults must be reported immediately to the site supervisor and the machine not used until repairs can be made. Only competent operators are permitted to use this equipment. All operators are trained / competent and should recognise the machines capabilities and limitations.	4	1	4
Falls and trips resulting in injury by mower Cuts, abrasions, serious injury	4	3	12	Non-slip safety boots must be worn at all times whilst mowing. The automatic 'dead man's handle' prevents injury by machine should the operator slip or fall Care must be taken when loading and unloading the mower.	4	2	8
Manual handling Sprains, strains, Back pain, discomfort, musculoskeletal disorders	3	3	9	The machine should be allowed to do the work - it should not be necessary to use 'brute strength' to manoeuvre around obstacles/corners. As a minimum eye protection, safety glasses should be worn at all times when operating the machine. Where possible and particularly when cutting tall vegetation /rougher ground / amongst furniture or other fixed objects which may deflect ejected material towards the operator, it is advised to also use the helmet visor.</p> <p>Non essential personnel should be kept away from the danger zone.</p> <p>Operatives should carry out an initial inspection of the work area, as part of the on site risk assessment, prior to any mowing tasks commencing.</p>	4	2	8

Any such hazards should be highlighted during the on-site risk assessment process and all operatives reminded of the possible hazards that may exist.</p> <p>Ensure that all materials are cleared away from access and egress areas</p> <p>Operatives shall be required to wear suitable safety footwear when completing work activities and ensure they keep their footwear free from muck build up, to maintain good grip.</p>	3	2	6

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
